Dear Executive Director,

Under Secretary Ben Carson's leadership, health in housing is a premier priority for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, and we thank you for your diligence in helping to ensure safe housing conditions for the residents we serve.

It has come to our attention, through the investigative reporting of *The Oregonian*, that radon testing and mitigation has not received the attention HUD's Office of Public and Indian Housing has encouraged. The Department is continuing its commitment to educate and inform the public about radon.

It is your obligation to provide safe, decent, and sanitary housing in your community, and this obligation includes testing and mitigating exposure to harmful toxins in homes. Furthermore, a majority of you are legally obligated under state law to test for radon.

In 2013, the Office of Public and Indian Housing (PIH) issued a notice (PIH-2013-06) providing public housing agencies (PHAs) information about health risks of radon exposure, advising PHAs to learn about local radon policies, and encouraging PHAs to test and mitigate radon.
