FEI:

National Sunshine I - Thursday Welcome and Saturday Grand Prix.

National Sunshine II – Thursday Welcome and Saturday World Cup Qualifier. Grand Prix Horse Stall: Horses entered in a FEI Grand Prix are required to stable in the FEI Barn. Stalls in the FEI Barn are permanent 12 x 12 box stalls. Horses must be entered in the FEI Grand Prix and/or World Cup Qualifier in order to be eligible for Secure Stabling.

Official Jog: Please check with the Stable Office for stall assignment prior to the jog.

National Sunshine I: Wednesday at 7 am. This jog is for horses entered in the Thursday and/or Saturday FEI Grand Prix. National Sunshine II: Wednesday at 7 am. This jog is for horses entered in the Thursday FEI Grand Prix and/or the Saturday World Cup Qualifier.

Secure Stabling Begins: Horses will proceed to Secure Stabling after the jog.

Secure Stabling Ends: At the conclusion of the horse's final FEI Grand Prix class each week, horses are required to vacate the Secure Stabling area. Horses are not permitted to remain in Secure Stabling after Sunday unless they are showing in FEI classes the next week.

Horses Per Rider Limit: In World Cup Qualifying classes, riders are limited to two horses and must ride their World Cup horse first. In other classes, riders are limited to three (3) Horses.

Identification: Once the horse has entered Secure Stabling it must wear its assigned entry number when not in its stall. Horses may be ridden or exercised only in the supervised designated Grand Prix Schooling Ring.

Credentials: Special credentials will be required for all owners, riders, trainers, grooms wishing to access the FEI Barn. Riding/Schooling/Lunging Schedule: To be posted.

Riders Meeting: The FEI World Cup Qualifier Riders Meeting will be held prior to the competition at a time to be announced. Riders are encouraged to attend. Any changes/additions will be announced at that time.

The Show Committee reserves to itself, the right to interpret any question or occurrence with regard to the conduct or compliance of any rider without claims for damages or recourse of any kind and the Show Committee's decision will be final.

FEI INFORMATION: "This event is organized in accordance with:

- FEI Statutes, 23rd edition, effective 1st January 2009,
- FEI General Regulations, 23rd edition, effective 1st January 2009,
- FEI Veterinary Regulations, 11th edition 2009,

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE: The Fédération Equestre International (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

 At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farrier and tack, and transportation.

WORLD CUP QUALIFIER HORSE & RIDER INFORMATION FEI VETERINARY EXAMINATION, INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS: The veterinary inspection: will be carried out in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1011, "General Regulations", 21st Edition, 1 January 2005, will apply: In accordance with Art.139.1, Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country, and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries, must have a valid official FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI, accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card, as a means of identification and to establish ownership. In accordance with Art, 139,2. Horses taking part in CNs, and CIMs in their country of residence are not required to have a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable by diagram. Unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate. EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, Vet Regs. Appendix VI: All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between one and three months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months +21 days, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding seven days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables. The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES, (VET. REGS, CHAP. V & VI AND ANNEX III): Regular sampling is carried out in CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. The number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate, however a minimum of three is recommended (Art. VR 1016).

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Group I & II only).

INSURANCE: All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

EQUINE HEALTH ENTRY REQUIREMENTS HITS Desert Horse Park, Thermal, California

Protecting the health of your horse and other horses at the HITS Desert Horse Park is of the utmost importance to HITS. HITS has implemented these **Required Biosecurity Measures** to decrease the risk of introduction and/or spread of contagious or infectious disease at its shows.

Horses must arrive only between the hours of **8 am - 5 pm dally**. Off-hours arrivals must obtain permission from Show Management by calling 760.399.9200 24 hours prior to arrival.

UPON ENTRY TO THE HITS DESERT HORSE PARK, ALL HORSES MUST HAVE AND PROVIDE:

EVENT PARTICIPATION DECLARATION

Required

Signed by the owner/agent/trainer verifying that the horse has been healthy with no sign of infectious disease and has not had a fever above 102°F within 72 hours (3 days) of arrival. Required for all horses entering the Show Grounds both Showing and Non-Showing. A new Event Participation Form must be filed each time the horse enters the property. Event Participation Declaration Form available in this prize list.

PROOF OF VACCINATION

Required

Via a signed statement from the attending veterinarian that the horse has been vaccinated against the following:

Within 6 months (180 days) of each show: **Equine Influenza (EIV)**Within 3 months (90 days) of each show: **Rhinopneumonitis (EHV 1 and EHV 4)**

If a vaccination will expire during one of the shows, the horse must receive its new vaccination prior to being issued a competition number for that show.

Statement of vaccination must be on Official Letterhead and must contain the Show Name of each horse.

PRESENTATION OF HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

These documents must be presented upon entry to the show grounds and copies must be filed in the Show Office **before any competition numbers will be issued**. The results on all required papers must indicate the horse's registered (show) name.

Any horse not accompanied by these documents will be directed to the Show Veterinarian to obtain the required documents and/or vaccinations, and/or will be placed in quarantined stabling until the proper documents are obtained. Any horse showing signs of fever/illness/stress is subject to examination by HITS Officials and/or the Show Veterinarian, who may at their sole discretion, place the horse in quarantined stabling or take further action if deemed necessary.

GENERAL

Poling: Poling is prohibited in the State of California.

Parade of Champions: A parade will be held each Sunday prior to the start of the Grand Prix.

Awards: Ribbons will be awarded to eighth place in all classes unless otherwise noted.

International Riders: All classes held will be run under National rules with regard to riders with the exception of the FEI classes. If the capacity of International riders exceeds the National riders rule, riders will be accepted on a 1st come, 1st served basis.

HUNTERS

General: All classes in rated hunter divisions will be judged on performance and soundness and when indicated, conformation, suitability or manners.

Jog: The following sections will not jog: Low, Schooling, Baby Green, Pre-Green, Adult, Children's, Modified Child, Modified Adult, Modified Junior/Amateur, Pre-Child, Pre-Adult, Short Stirrup.

Hunter Champion and Reserve: Awarded to two of the four horses scoring the most points over fences. In addition, only these will receive full points for ribbons won under saddle and half points for ribbons won in the model.

Warm-Up: Ticketed warm-ups will be offered daily Tuesday through Thursday from 8 AM - 5 PM. Tickets are \$25 each and available in the Show Office. Schooling is prohibited in the show rings.

2014 Zone 10 Specifications: (Check USHJA.org for the most updated specs.)

- Adult Hunters: Horses and ponies. Horses or riders may not cross enter into any A-O Hunter Class, except the U/S. Riders may not cross enter into 1st Year, 2nd Year or High Performance at the same show. Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same show with fences exceeding 3'3" except Adult Jumpers, Jr/Am Mod Jumpers, Equitation and Medal Classes. Fences 3', spreads not to exceed fence height.
- Children's Hunters: Horses and ponies. Horses/Ponies or riders may not cross enter into any Jr. Hunter Class, except the U/S. Riders may not cross enter into 1st Year, 2nd Year or High Performance at the same show. Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same show with fences exceeding 3'3" except Child Jumpers, Jr/Am Mod Jumpers, Eq. and Medal Classes. Fences 3', spreads not to exceed fence height. If Child Hunter Pony is offered, fences must be set at 2' for small/mediums and 2'6' for larges.
- Pre-Green Hunter: A horse of any age in its first or second year of showing over fences 3' to 3'3", and that has never shown over fences 3'6" or higher. Fences 3'. Horses may not cross enter into 3'6" divisions. Refer to HU106.3 for additional information.

IUMPERSJumper Nomination Fee: \$175

Nominated Jumper Sections: Level 5, 6, 7, 8, Grand Prix, A-O, and Junior Jumper.

Non-Nominated Jumper Sections: Level 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, Adult, Children's, Pony and Modified Child/Adult. These horses should enter their classes in timely order to avoid Class Post Entry Fees. Nominated Jumpers showing in these classes should enter their classes timely in order to avoid post entry fees.

Warm-Up 3': Ticketed warm-ups will be offered Tuesday from 8 AM - 5 PM. Tickets are \$25 each and available in the Show Office. Schooling is prohibited in the show rings.

Eligibility: Any horse, regardless of winnings, is eligible to enter any Level 0-8 and Open Jumper class.

Declarations: Nominated Jumpers must declare on the appropriate form in the Show Office by 5 pm the day before the class is to be held. Classes may be scratched the day of prior to the class starting with no penalty - exception: Special Classes. Classes entered on the Entry Blank constitute a Declaration.

Jumper Tables: Refer to the Time Schedule.

Time Allowed: The Time Allowed will be based on a speed of 382 yards per minute for all sections unless otherwise noted, and may be adjusted accordingly.

Martingales: Classes offered at 1.30m or below—No martingale restrictions when used in a conventional manner. Classes offered above 1.30m (and all classes restricted to young horses)—The only martingales permitted are running martingales used in the conventional manner. Draw Reins. Draw reins may only be used when schooling or in classes offered at 1.30m or below. Ponies may not be ridden by a Junior in draw reins or German martingales at any time.

Tles: Ties involving first place will be jumped off. Ties not involving first place will be decided upon time unless otherwise stated.

24 Hour Rule: Horses must be stabled on the grounds 24 hours prior to any class with prize money of \$25,000 or more.

- Children's and Adult Jumpers: Horses or riders may not cross enter into any Junior Jumper or A-O class at the same show. Exception: Low Junior and Amateur Jumpers at these shows, where fence height is 3'11". Riders may not cross enter into any Jumper class at the same show with fences exceeding 1.20m (3'11"). Fences must be at 1.10m for the first class of the section and no lower than 1.10m and no higher than 1.15m for succeeding classes.
- Low Children's and Low Adult Jumpers: Horses or riders may not cross enter into any Junior or A-O Jumper class at the same show. Riders may not cross enter into any Jumper class at the same show with fences exceeding 1.20m (3'11").

CONDITIONS & SPECIFICATIONS

SPECIAL CLASSES

The General Rules and Regulations of the Horse Show will prevail for the Special Classes except as provided for each individual class and as noted herein.

FEI World Cup Qualifying Class National Sunshine I&II

- Specs: To be conducted and scored under FEI Table A. Article 238.2.2. Speed 350 meters/min (382 yards per minute). Competition will be held in an outdoor arena measuring approximately 170 feet by 280 feet. Each competitor will jump one round over a course of at least 16 fences at the High Performance Standard. After the first round, in the event of equality of faults for first place only, there will be one jump-off in which time will decide. Other competitors will be placed according to their penalties in the first round. Riders will receive qualifying points through 16th place.
- Horse Limit: Riders are limited to two horses.
- Designation of "World Cup" Horse: If riding two horses, a rider is required to specify his/her World Cup horse when making declarations and must ride his/her World Cup horse FIRST. If a rider scratches his/her World Cup horse, his/her second horse will move into this place in the jumping order, and will become his/her World Cup horse.

Other Grand Prix -

- Specs: Table II.2.a. National Standard.
- Horse Limit: Riders are not limited to the number of horses they may ride in World Cup Qualifying classes and three (3) Horses in others.
- Designation of "Computer List" Horse: If riding more than one horse, a rider is required to specify his/her Computer List horse when making declarations and must ride his/her Computer List horse first. If a rider scratches his/her Computer List horse, his/her second horse will move into this place in the jumping order, and will become his/her Computer List horse. If a rider does not designate their Computer List horse prior to the start of the competition, his/her Computer List horse will be the first horse he/she rides in the competition.

Computer List Classes: National Sunshine I - All Grand Prix are eligible. National Sunshine II - Thursday & Saturday Grand Prix are eligible.

Special Hunter Classics: Judged on performance and soundness with manners and suitability emphasized. To be scored under the open numerical judging system. The top 15 (or 1/3) horses (ponies) from the first round will return to jump a second round in reverse order of their scores in the first round; lowest score going first and highest score going last. In case of ties, order of those tied will be drawn. Scores will be averaged from both rounds to determine the winners. In case of a tie for first place only, judges will confer to break the tie. All other ties will remain and riders will toss a coin for the ribbons.

- Separate Two Round Classic For the first round, each competitor will jump one round of approximately 10-12 fences at the required height.
- Designated First Round Classic A designated class of the Division will be the first round of the Classic. You must enter the Classic prior to the start of the first round class. Scratches are not permitted after the First round class has begun. See Time Schedule for Designated First round class.

Special Class Nomination/Declaration: Special Classes added on the day of or after the Order of Go has been drawn will be required to work first in the order.

Special Class Scratch: Any scratch must be made before the class starts. See Rules & Regulations for more information. In the event of scratch on the day of the class, horses are subject to the Classic / Grand Prix Scratch Fee.

Order of Go: The Order of Go will be drawn. In the jump-off, if any, all horses will go in the original drawn order.

Attire: Formal attire required in Special Classes.

Awards: Winners to ride for presentation of awards in Special Classes.

Trophy & Ribbons: 1-8 or 1-12 in Special Classes unless otherwise stated.

Show Champion: Classics will not count toward Show Awards.

• CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION •

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 nonmember registration fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions, 8) Opportunity classes; 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

• USEF ENTRY AGREEMENT •

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/ or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR 908.4.

The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final.

The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges; to change specifications in Jumper classes as competition warrants.

Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

ENTRY CLOSING DATE: Must be RECEIVED by: Wednesday, September 24, 2014

ENTRY PROCEDURE:

- Fees must be paid in U.S. funds. Checks drawn on Canadian banks must be preprinted by a financial institution with the legend "U.S. Funds".
- Visa, Master Card, & American Express are accepted. See the insert in this book for forms and instructions for paying by credit card. Customers paying by credit card should reference the Retail Catalog for pricing.
- Horse Deposit Fee and all other applicable fees on the Entry Form must be submitted with the Entry Form or the Entry will be considered Late.

ENTRY CLARIFICATION:

- Classes may only be entered or declared by using a Class Number. A Class Number written on the Entry Form, Add Scratch Form, or Barn Add/Scratch Form constitutes a Class Entry or Class Declaration.
- An entry with incomplete information for horse, owner, rider or trainer such as a horse entered as "Entry" or "TBA" or an entry with missing USEF/USHJA or signatures, will be subject to the \$75 Incomplete Entry Fee.
- Equitation riders must ride the horse and wear the number of the horse they have entered to ride. There is no penalty for the rider to scratch an equitation class from one horse and add it on another horse.
- Any exhibitor who does not compete in a class in which he/she is officially entered, and does not scratch according to the Scratch Procedures outlined below, will be billed for the class.
- Horses shown in a class without being officially entered will be assessed a penalty as shown below.
- Exhibitors are responsible for a knowledge of the Rules and Regulations governing the horse show and for their own errors and omissions. In the case of a violation of a cross entry restriction, the exhibitor will forfeit the entry fee, class placing and prize money award.
- Show means the Show Week.
- Non-Showing horse is designated by marking the "Non-Showing" box in the area of the Entry Form used to enter classes, and must be on the entry form when entry is submitted. There is a \$25 fee. Leaving the class area "blank" constitutes an entry and will be charged a Scratch Fee if the horse does not show.

ADD/SCRATCH/CHANGE: Any class add, scratch, or change, or any complete Show Scratch must be made in writing in the Show Office on an official form, by facsimile, by letter, or via the shows online add/scratch form. by email, and received prior to the start of the applicable class or show. Once a class or division begins, it may not be scratched, except for a Vet Scratch. If a Vet Scratch, the horse must be scratched in the Show Office on the day of the class and the Official Show Vet's Certificate must be received that day. Scratch Fee will still apply.

COMBINING, DIVIDING OR CANCELING DIVISIONS, CLASSES OR CLASSICS:

The Decision to Combine, Cancel or Divide classes will be made at the discretion of Show Management within one hour of the close of the Horse Show Office the night before the class. The update will be noted on the "How Many" schedule on the website.

REFUNDS:

- Refund of pre-paid fees will be given for show scratches received prior to or on the Closing Date.
 Scratches must be made in writing according to the procedure outlined above.
- Refund for Horse Deposits, Stalls, Grand Prix Nominations, Paddocks, RV Sites or VIP will not be given after the Closing Date. Exhibitors are responsible for any such outstanding fees.
- If eligible for refund, a check for refund due less an office fee of \$25 will be mailed within 30 days after the completion of the circuit.
- Billing questions or request for refund will not be considered after the show in question.

MOVE IN / MOVE OUT DATE RESTRICTIONS:

• Monday noon to the following Monday noon of each Show Week. Stabling NOT available before Monday, Oct 27, due to an airshow. Exceptions only available with written permission.

STABLING: Permanent Stalls are approximately 12'x12', with doors. Stall Fees are non-refundable after the Closing Date of Entries. Bedding on straw prohibited except when the horse's health is at issue. Please obtain prior approval from Stable Office.

PADDOCKS: Paddocks are of metal construction. Paddocks are non-refundable after the closing date of entries.

RV SPACES: On-site RV spaces include sewer, water and electrical hook-ups. RV spaces are nonrefundable after the Closing Date of Entries.

VIP CLUB: VIP Club Pavilion overlooks the Grand Prix Ring. VIP Club Membership includes seating for 6, and features Breakfast and Lunch Buffets Wednesday through Sunday, Dinner Thursday, Friday, Saturday and a cash bar. After the closing date of entries, VIP Club fees are non-refundable.

VALET PARKING: A limited number of Valet Parking Passes will be available.

SERVICES:

- <u>Feed Store</u>: Hay, grain and bedding may be purchased on the grounds. For deliveries prior to or upon arrival, use the Feed Order form in the prize list or online at HitsShows.com.
- <u>Horse Watch</u>: Horses stabled on the show grounds will receive the complimentary service of Horse Watch. Horse Watch extends from approximately 9:00 pm until 5:00 am daily.
- <u>Trainer's Splits</u>: Splits will be accepted until noon Friday. Only items billed by the horse show such as feed, bedding, tack stalls, etc., will be split. Splits will revert back to the trainer for payment if uncollected.

NON-NEGOTIABLE CHECKS/CREDIT CARDS:

• Returned Checks or Credit Cards: for any reason will be assessed a penalty of \$50 or 10% of the face value of the check or credit card, whichever is greater. Upon notification, exhibitors will have three days to make full payment, including penalty, in certified funds, cashier's check, money order or by credit card. A 3% Retail Adjustment will be applied to all Credit Card transactions. Sanctioning organizations will be notified if exhibitors fail to pay in full within three days.

PRIZE MONEY:

- <u>Prize Money</u> is issued to the "Recipient of Prize Money" recorded on the entry form. A valid Social Security or Federal ID number must be provided. Checks will be mailed or hand-delivered within 30 days after the Show.
- <u>Prize Money Won by Foreign Exhibitors</u> is subject to the US Internal Revenue Service regulation requiring sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money.
- <u>Add Back Prize Money</u> is computed from the number of horses that actually show. Horses entered but not shown forfeit the add back money.
- <u>Prize Money</u> is awarded through 6th place in Hunter classes and through 8th place in Jumper classes unless otherwise noted.

ASSOCIATION MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

- <u>Owner-Rider-Trainer</u>: Present to the Show Secretary proof of current membership for USEF and USHJA, or pay non-member fees.
- Grand Prix Riders: World Cup riders and horses must be registered with the FEI a week prior to showing.
- <u>Adult or Amateur Status</u>: Riders showing in classes restricted to Adults or Amateurs must have USEF Amateur Certification.
- <u>USEF Horse Recording</u>: Horses must be Recorded with USEF Annually or for Life in order to be eligible for HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards.
- <u>USHJA Horse Registrations</u>: All horses competing in USEF licensed Hunter/Jumper/Eq competitions must have or obtain a Registration Number from USHJA.
- <u>Horse/Pony Measurement Card</u>: Junior Hunters, Pony Hunters, Children's Pony Hunters, and Pony Jumpers must have a valid USEF Measurement Card or copy of a valid Measurement Form, or be measured. Foreign Association Measurement cards are not accepted.

FOREIGN EXHIBITOR ASSOCIATION REQUIREMENTS:

- <u>Owner, Rider, Trainer</u>: Must provide proof in writing (English) that they are a member in good standing of their national federation.
- <u>Junior, Amateur or Adult Status</u>: Riders showing in classes restricted to Jr., Am. or Adults must present their membership card or other documentation indicating their Jr. or Am. status. Foreign Amateurs must be members of or join USEF/USHJA and sign for Amateur Status.

ASSOCIATION HORSE REQUIREMENTS:

- Horse Fee: PCHA \$3, USEF \$8, USHJA \$2
- Horse Drug Fee: CDFA \$5, FEI \$28 (for World Cup horses), USEF \$8.
- High Performance Fees: Horses entered in Grand Prix classes are required to pay the \$35 IHP fee.

FACILITY INFORMATION:

- Footing at the HITS Desert Horse Park is all-weather.
- Ring sizes may change from show week to show week and notice will be posted in the Show Office.
- Food Service will be available every day.
- Lunging will be allowed in the designated areas only.

HEALTH & VETERINARY:

- Sharps & Medical Waste must be placed in the proper receptacles. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to a fine or other penalties deemed necessary by Show Management.
- <u>Show Veterinarian</u> is in residence on the show grounds. The Vet's phone number will be posted at the Show Office.
- Equine Health Requirements will be enforced. All horses (competing or not) that enter the grounds are required to present the Required Health Entry Requirements. All horses are be subject to examination by HITS officials/designated representatives and/or state officials (collectively "officials") for determining whether such animals are, have been infected/exposed, or are likely to become infected with an infectious or contagious disease.

SAFETY:

Accidents Involving Competitors. Refer to GR1317. In the event of a head injury due to a fall/accident at a licensed competition, the competitor may be prohibited from further competition until released by medical personnel. In some cases, the competitor may not return to competition without a signed release from a licensed medical professional. The competitor may be placed on suspension by USEF until this criteria is met.

- <u>Protective Headgear</u>: is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes, when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee and Licensed Official are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. GR 801.2,7.
- Motorized Vehicles and Golf Carts: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which

allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

- <u>Dogs must be restrained on the show grounds</u>: Loose dogs anywhere on the grounds will be picked up and detained and the owner fined \$100.
- Electrical/Fire Regulations: Electrical installation and connections must meet all state and county codes. Aisles shall be maintained clear for a minimum of six feet wide by eight feet high. No obstructions or projections shall be allowed in these aisles. No Class I Flammable Liquids such as gasoline are allowed inside the buildings. Cooking is not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to dismissal from further participation in the horse show without recourse. Additional appliances are not permitted within any stable area. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to confiscation of the item(s).
- <u>Damage</u>: Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordinally.
- Alcoholic Beverages in any form may not be brought onto the show grounds.

DIRECTIONS:

From points West: From I-10 E. Keep RIGHT to take CA-86 Spur S toward Brawley / El Centro. 6.5 miles. Turn RIGHT onto Airport Blvd. 2.2 miles. End at 85-555 Airport Blvd.

<u>From points East</u>: From I-10 W. Take the Dillon Rd exit toward CA-86S Expressway / Coachella. 0.2 miles. Turn LEFT onto Dillon Rd. 0.7 miles. Turn LEFT to take the CA-86S-Expressway S ramp. 0.2 miles, Merge onto CA-86 Spur S. 5.2 miles. Turn RIGHT onto Airport Blvd. 2.2 miles. End at 85-555 Airport Blvd.


